MATERIALS:

1-5/8 yards Cactus Cream

3/4 yard Butterflies

1-1/4 yards Words

5/8 yard Signs

1/2 yard Flags

3/4 yard Blender Red

1 yard Blender Cream

1-5/8 yard Blender Blue (includes Binding)

READ THROUGH ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE STARTING THIS PROJECT. FABRICS ARE SEWN RIGHT-SIDES TOGETHER USING A 1/4" SEAM ALLOWANCE THROUGHOUT. WOF = WIDTH OF FABRIC; HST = HALF SQUARE TRI-ANGLE; CSB = COLLECTIBLE SHOP BLOCK; RST = RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER

ALL 4-1/2" SQUARES ARE USED IN 9-PATCHES, ALL 5" SQUARES ARE USED FOR HST IN 9-PATCHES AND ALL 4" SQUARES ARE USED FOR 8 AT ONCE HST. IF YOU HAVE COL-LECTED SOME OF THE CSB AND WOULD LIKE TO INCORPORATE THEM INTO YOUR QUILT, THEY WOULD FIT NICELY AS A SUBSTITUTE FOR SOME OF THE 4-1/2" BLENDER CREAM SQUARES IN THE 9-PATCH BLOCKS.

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

From Cactus Cream Fabric:

Cut [4] $- 4-1/2'' \times WOF$ strips (A) Cut [4] $- 4-1/2'' \times WOF$ strips (C) Cut [3] $- 4-1/2'' \times WOF$ strips Subcut [24] - 4-1/2'' squares Cut [1] $- 5'' \times WOF$ strip Subcut [4] - 5'' squares

From Words Fabric:

Cut [2] $- 4-1/2'' \times$ WOF strips (A) Cut [2] $- 4-1/2'' \times$ WOF strips (B) Cut [1] $- 4-1/2'' \times$ WOF strip (D) Cut [3] $- 4-1/2'' \times$ WOF strips Subcut [26] - 4-1/2'' squares Cut [1] $- 5'' \times$ WOF strip Subcut [3] - 5'' squares Subcut [4] - 4'' squares (P)

From Blender Cream Fabric:

Cut [1] $- 4-1/2'' \times WOF$ strip **(B)** Cut [2] $- 4-1/2'' \times WOF$ strips **(C)** Cut [2] $- 4-1/2'' \times WOF$ strips **(D)** Cut [1] $- 4-1/2'' \times WOF$ strip Subcut [8] - 4-1/2'' squares Cut [1] $- 5'' \times WOF$ strip Subcut [3] - 5'' squares

From Butterflies Fabric:

Cut [4] $- 4-1/2'' \times WOF$ strips Subcut [30] - 4-1/2'' squares Cut [1] $- 5'' \times WOF$ strip Subcut [4] - 5'' squares Cut [1] $- 4'' \times WOF$ strip Subcut [4] - 4'' squares **(O)**

From Flags Fabric:

Cut [2] — 4-1/2" × WOF strips Subcut [12] — 4-1/2" squares Cut [1] — 5" square

From Signs Fabric:

Cut [3] $- 4-1/2'' \times WOF$ strips Subcut [19] - 4-1/2'' squares Cut [1] $- 5'' \times WOF$ strip Subcut [3] - 5'' squares

From Blender Red Fabric:

Cut [1] $- 1-1/2'' \times$ WOF strip Subcut [16] - 1-1/2'' squares Cut [1] $- 4'' \times$ WOF strip Subcut [4] - 4'' squares **(N)** Cut [8] $- 2-1/2'' \times$ WOF strips for inner border. Sew together end to end Subcut [2] $- 2-1/2'' \times 76-1/2''$ strips **(A)** Subcut [2] $- 2-1/2'' \times 60-1/2''$ strips **(B)**

From Blender Blue Fabric:

Cut [8] — 4-1/2" \times WOF strips for outer border. Sew together end to end

Subcut [2] $- 4-1/2'' \times 64-1/2''$ strips **(C)** Subcut [2] $- 4-1/2'' \times 76-1/2''$ strips **(D)**

From Binding Fabric:

Cut [9] – 2" \times WOF strips (E)

BLOCK ASSEMBLY:

Star Block:

- Refer to the cutting requirements list, quilt photo and quilt layout diagram for the placement prints.
- Follow pressing arrows for successful piecing.
- All HSTS for the stars are constructed using the Eight at once method as explained below. These will use the 4" squares.

Eight At Once Method:

- 1. Pair [2] equal sized squares RST, raw edges aligned.
- 2. Draw [2] diagonal lines from corner to corner on the wrong side of the lighter square.
- 3. Sew a scant 1/4" on each side of the drawn lines (a).
- 4. Cut the square into 8 sections in the following order:
 - a. Once vertically at the halfway measurement.
 - b. Once horizontally at the halfway measurement.
 - c. On the diagonals between the lines of stitching.
 - d. Trim up the squares as needed. (Tucker Trimmer 1 was used for trimming.)



Star Block Assembly:

 Using the 8 at a time method, make HST in the following combinations: (N/O), (N/P), (P/O) to make 1-1/2" HSTs. Square up as needed. Make [2] sets of each, making [16] HSTs of each of the 3-color combinations.



- 2. Arrange [4] HSTs (**P/O**) into a 4-patch unit as shown. Sew the HSTs into rows.
- Sew the rows together to make a pinwheel (2" square) Make [4]. See Spinning Seams sidebar for pressing Pinwheels.



3. Sew HSTs (N/O) & (N/P) together side to side as shown to make Unit 1. Make [16].



4. Sew (2) Unit 1 to either side of the pinwheel as shown. Make [4].



5. Sew **(N)** squares to each end of the remaining units to make Unit 2. Make [8].



6. Sew a Unit 2 to the top, another to the bottom of the pinwheel to complete the star block. Measures 4-1/2" square. Make [4].



Spinning Seams

Turn the pinwheel to the wrong side. Notice the direction of the seams in the block. Working with the last seam sewn, push half of it in the same direction of the nearby seams, the other half in the opposite direction. You may need to unstitch a few stitches in the center seam allowances if there is any resistance to lying flat. When done correctly, a tiny pinwheel appears in the very center and all the seams lie flat in the circular direction around the block.



State of Texas Blocks: For Piecing Half Square Triangle Units



- 1. Position two 5" squares RST. Draw a diagonal directly down the middle from corner to corner.
- 2. Mark two stitching lines 1/4'' on either side of the center diagonal line.
- 3. Stitch on the lines, then cut down the middle.
- 4. Trim to 4-1/2'' The Tucker Trimer has been found to create more accurate HST.
- 5. Make the following combinations of HST using the 5" squares:

2 Butterflies/2 Blender Cream	4 HST
2 Butterflies/2 Cactus Cream	4 HST (1 extra)
1 Signs/1 Words	2 HST (1 extra)
1 Cactus Cream/1 Words	2 HST (1 extra)
1 Cactus Cream/1 Signs	2 HST (1 extra)
1 Signs/1 Blender Cream	2 HST (1 extra)
1 Flags/1 Words	2 HST (1 extra)

6. Lay the 4-1/2'' blocks as shown in the following diagram. Sew the top [3] blocks together for each block, the middle [3] blocks together, the last row of blocks together.

7. Then join the [3] rows together and press. Blocks are 12" square finished. 15 blocks. REMINDER ALL HST for the 9-patch will be trimmed to 4-1/2'' squares.

- 5. Sew [2] Unit A to both sides of Unit B, Make $[8] - 12 \cdot 1/2''$ square Blocks. You will have [1]extra.



9-Patch Block B

- 1. Unit C: Using [2] Cactus Cream $4-1/2'' \times WOF$ strips and [1] Blender Cream 4-1/2" \times WOF strip, sew the Blender Cream strip inbetween the [2] Cactus Cream strips along the long edges. Make [2].
- 2. Subcut strip sets into [16] $4 \cdot 1/2'' \times 12 \cdot 1/2''$ sections.



3. Unit D: Using [2] Blender Cream $4-1/2'' \times$ WOF strips and [1] Words $4-1/2'' \times WOF$ strip, sew the Words strip inbetween the [2] Words strips along the long edges. Make [1].



4. Subcut strip sets into [8] - 4-1/2" × 12-1/2" sections.

9-Patch Assembly:

9-Patch Block A

- 1. Unit A: Using [2] Cactus Cream $4-1/2'' \times WOF$ strips and [1] Words $4-1/2'' \times WOF$ strip, sew the Words strip inbetween the [2] Cactus Cream strips along the long edges. Make [2].
- 2. Subcut strip sets into [16] $4-1/2'' \times 12-1/2''$ sections. Unit A



- 3. **Unit B**: Using [2] Words $4-1/2'' \times WOF$ strips and [1] Blender Cream $4-1/2'' \times WOF$ strip, sew the Words strip inbetween the [2] Words strips along the long edges. Make [1].
- 4. Subcut strip sets into $[8] 4 \cdot 1/2'' \times 12 \cdot 1/2''$ sections.

 Sew [2] Unit C to both sides of Unit D. Make [8] – 12-1/2" square Blocks. You will have one extra.

QUILT TOP ASSEMBLY:

1. Sew blocks together into rows, and rows together into quilt top center.

9 Patch B, 9 Patch A, Block B, Block L, Block K, 9 Patch A

9 Patch B, Block F, Block G, Block H, Block I, 9 Patch A



Row 5

9 Patch A, 9 Patch B, 9 Patch A, Block O, Block N, 9 Patch B



BORDERS:

Inner Border

- 1. Sew [2] **(B)** strips to each side of the quilt top center.
- 2. Sew [2] (A) strips to top and bottom of the quilt top center.



Outer Border

1. Sew [2] **(C)** strips to each side of the quilt top center.



 Sew a star to each end of the (D) strips. Make (2).



3. Sew [2] (D) strips to the top and bottom of the quilt top center.



FINISHING:

- 1. Layer batting and backing.
- 2. Baste and Quilt.
- 3. Bind using the 2" Blender Blue strips (E)
- 4. Enjoy!
