1-3/4 yards Signs

- 1-3/4 yards Armadillo
- 3/4 yard Butterflies

3/4 yard Cactus Green

- 2 yards Words
- 2-1/4 yards (108"WOF) for backing (2-1/2 yards if adding optional border)

Batting 84" x 84"

READ THROUGH ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE STARTING THIS PROJECT. FABRICS ARE SEWN RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER USING A 1/4" SEAM ALLOWANCE THROUGHOUT. CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS ARE BASED ON 40" WOF. WOF = WIDTH OF FABRIC; RST = RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

From Signs Fabric:

Cut [2] $- 4-1/2'' \times$ WOF strips Subcut [16] - 4-1/2'' squares (C) Cut [2] $- 5-1/4'' \times$ WOF strips Subcut [8] - 5-1/4'' squares (D) Cut [1] $- 2-1/2'' \times$ WOF strip Subcut [16] - 2-1/2'' squares, Cornerstones Cut [8] $- 4-1/2'' \times$ WOF strips, Outside Border

From Armadillo Fabric:

Cut [2] $- 4-1/2'' \times$ WOF strips Subcut [16] - 4-1/2'' squares (A) Cut [2] $- 5-1/4'' \times$ WOF strips Subcut [8] - 5-1/4'' squares (B) Cut [8] $- 2-1/2'' \times$ WOF strips, Inside Border Cut [8] $- 2-1/4'' \times$ WOF strips for Binding

From Butterflies Fabric:

Cut [3] $- 4-1/2'' \times WOF$ strips Subcut [20] - 4-1/2'' squares **(E)** Cut [2] $- 5-1/4'' \times WOF$ strips Subcut [10] - 5-1/4'' squares **(F)**

From Cactus Green Fabric:


Cut [3] $- 4-1/2'' \times$ WOF strips Subcut [20] - 4-1/2'' squares **(G)** Cut [2] $- 5-1/4'' \times$ WOF strips Subcut [10] - 5-1/4'' squares **(H)**

From Words Fabric:

- Cut [6] 5-1/4" × WOF strips Subcut [8] — 5-1/4" squares (B) Subcut [8] — 5-1/4" squares (D) Subcut [10] — 5-1/4" squares (F) Subcut [10] — 5-1/4" squares (H)
- Cut [2] 16-1/2" \times WOF strips Subcut [24] – 2-1/2" \times 16-1/2" rectangles for sashing

BLOCK ASSEMBLY:

Create 2 At-A-Time Half-Square Triangles:




Using [2] 5-1/4 squares per set, pair the following fabrics:

Unit B: [8] Words with [8] Armadillo = Yield [16] **Unit D:** [8] Words with [8] Signs = Yield [16]

Unit F: [10] Words with [10] Butterflies = Yield [20]


Unit H: [10] Words with [10] Cactus Green = Yield [20]


- 1. Draw a diagonal line corner to corner on the wrong side of one square per set.
- 2. Place fabrics right side together.
- 3. Sew 1/4'' on each side of the line.
- 4. Cut on the drawn line.
- 5. Open and press flat.
- 6. Trim to 4-1/2" square.




Star Blocks:

- Using the HSTs and 4-1/2" squares
 (A) (C) (E) (G), arrange as shown below.
- 2. Sew neighboring units together. Press.
- 3. Sew neighboring rows together matching seams. Press. Make quantities as shown.






Star Block #1 **(SB1)** Make [4]

QUILT TOP ASSEMBLY:

- Arrange blocks according to shown at left. CS = Cornerstone; S = Sashing Row 1: CS - S - CS - S - CS - S - CS Row 2: S - SB2 - S - SB1 - S - SB2 - S Row 3: CS - S - CS - S - CS - S - CS Row 4: S - SB1 - S - SB2 - S - SB1 - S Row 5: CS - S - CS - S - CS - S - CS Row 6: S - SB2 - S - SB1 - S - SB2 - S Row 7: CS - S - CS - S - CS - S - CS
- 2. Sew neighboring components. Repeat until each row is sewn. Press seams.
- 3. Sew neighboring rows together. Press seams.
- 4. Repeat until all rows are sewn together creating the quilt top.



BORDERS: Collectible Store Blocks:

The goal of the 2024 All Texas Shop Hop is to visit as many of the fabric shops, which are featured in the event magazine, as possible – and gather the free Collectible Store Blocks (CSB). Each block measures 4" square finished (or 4-1/2" square unfinished). Should you not have all CSB, shop hop fabric substitutions may be made. Use a 4-1/2" square in place of a CSB. Additional fabric may be required based on the quantity of substituted CSB.

- 1. To achieve the necessary length for each border, place [2] fabric strips RST. Sew seam across the short end. Press.
- 2. Measure length. Add an additional strip(s) if necessary to achieve desired length.
- 3. Trim excess fabric.

Inside Border

Using Armadillo fabric, create: [2] sides 2-1/2" × 56-1/2" [2] top/bottom 2-1/2" × 60-1/2"

Optional Middle Border

- [64] Collectible Store Blocks, create
- [2] sides using [15] CSB: 4-1/2" × 60-1/2"
- [2] top/bottom using [17] CSB: 4-1/2" × 68-1/2"

Outside Border

Using Signs fabric, create: [2] sides 4-1/2" × 68-1/2" [2] top/bottom 4-1/2" × 76-1/2"

Optional: You can omit the Middle Border comprised of the CSB and just have the Outer Border of Signs fabric. Made this way the quilt would measure 68" square. [2] sides $4-1/2" \times 60-1/2"$ [2] top/bottom $4-1/2" \times 68-1/2"$

When attaching borders to the quilt top, it is important to be careful not to stretch the fabric. A wavy border will result. Measure and mark four equal sections of each border. Repeat for the section of the quilt top. Simply lay the border on the pressed quilt top matching the sections and pin to position.

- 1. Attach side borders. Press.
- 2. Attach top and bottom borders. Press.
- 3. Repeat the process for each border.

FINISHING:

- 1. Layer quilt top with batting and backing.
- 2. Baste and Quilt.
- 3. Bind with the binding strips.
- 4. Enjoy!
