FLOATING STAR

For a 14" finished (14 1/2" square)


- (1) 5" $\overline{\text{for center}}$
- (8) 5" backgrounds for corners
- (1) 2 ³/₄" x wof strip for 1 star point
- (1) 2 3/4" x wof strip for 1 other star point


Sewing Stars:


- 1. On the wrong side of (4) of the 5" background squares for star points mark the triangle. Use the Creative Grid'sTM Strippy Star RulerTM or Template Pattern.
- 2. Take one of the 2 3/4" strips place the fabric strip right sides up and the 5" squares wrong side up. Tilt the square so that the drawn line is

positioned ¼" from the edge of the strip. Leave roughly ¼" between the squares as you place them on the strip. Stitch down the strip – sewing one side of the triangle

- 3. Place your squares on an ironing surface and press the strips back over the corners of the squares. Rough cut the squares apart.
- 4. From the wrong side of the fabric trim the strip fabric even with the square fabric. You do not need to trim the layer of fabric under the star point.
- 5. Using a contrasting 2 3/4" strip this time you are going to repeat the process on the other lie on each square.
- 6. Place fabric strip right side up and the Square wrong side up. Tilt the marked fabric squares so that the drawn line is positioned ½" from the edge of the strip. Leave roughly ½" between squares as you place them on the strip. Stitch down the strip sewing on the line on the other side of the square.
- 7. Place your squares on ironing surface and press the strips back over the Corners of







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
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the squares. You do not need to trim the layer of fabric under the star point.

- 8. Your star point block should measure 5" square.
- 9. Using (4) star points, (4) background 5" squares and (1) center square to make a star (see layout) to make a star block. Your block should measure 14" now.

These star points will not go to the seams edge -to create the floating effect.




SMALLER STARS

For a 4 ½" finished (5" square)

- (1) 2" for center
- (8) 2" backgrounds for corners
- (1) 1 ½" x wof strip for 1 star point
- (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x wof strip for 1 other star point

Template for 2" square


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Template for 5" square
